The objective of this course is to understand Climate Change and the challenges it poses for humankind, to gain insight into the process of international climate negotiation, understand the connections between Climate Change, politics, society and economy and finally enhance your negotiation skills.

These objectives shall be achieved by using a varying course structure that includes:

Learning by Experiencing



Lectures:

Learning about Climate Change through experts from science, politics and business.



Teamwork:


Teaming up and adopting the role of a country delegation.

Researching on your country's background and develop your own negotiation strategy.



Simulation Role-play:

Experiencing the complexity of international climate negotiations in a 2,5 day close-to-reality roleplay together with students from all over Europe.

General Requirements

The participants are required to successfully pass a written exam, submit various papers (background paper, position paper and reflection paper) as a group (each individual's contribution needs to be indicated in order to receive individual's grades) and actively take part in the final strategic role play. The participants are expected to gain an in-depth insight into their role to be able to represent their delegation/NGO or lead the discussion as a chair. Furthermore, students should deal critically with the contributions of other participants. Active participation in the lectures is expected.

Please note, that expenses for travel and accommodation have to be covered by the students. In order to reduce CO2 emissions, travels by train to Barcelona will be supported through the Mercator travel grant.

Application

Due to the interactive nature of the course, the number of participants is limited.
