The participants are expected to gain an in-depth insight into their role to be able to represent their delegation/NGO or lead the discussion as a chair. Furthermore, students should deal critically with the contributions of other participants. Active participation in the lectures is expected.

Please note, that expenses for travel and accommodation have to be covered by the students. In order to reduce CO2 emissions, travels by train to Barcelona will be supported through the Mercator travel grant.

Due to the interactive nature of the course, the number of participants is limited.
